

# Harris Theater for Music and Dance Announces 2025–26 Season

Five Performances by The Joffrey Ballet Include a World Premiere

Silkroad Ensemble with Rhiannon Giddens Returns to the HTP Mainstage Series

Chicago, IL — The Joan W. and Irving B. Harris Theater for Music and Dance announces the 2025–26 season of its *Harris Theater Presents* (*HTP*) series. Launched in 2006, *HTP* continues to bring world-class artists to Chicago to tell stories of human experiences from a multitude of perspectives. *HTP* includes a variety of productions spanning multiple genres of music and dance, with artists hailing from around the globe. The Harris Theater is proud to be a home in Chicago for each of these artists and companies, from those performing in our city for the first time to those in long-standing partnerships, including Harris Theater Resident Companies.

"Like most artistic endeavors, a presented season is years in the making — full of dreaming and trust built between artists and presenters," explained Lori Dimun, President and CEO of the Harris Theater. "As a still-young and evolving institution, the Harris Theater has the freedom to shape each season with intention — to pursue bold ideas, amplify new voices, and respond to the diverse and growing audiences who come through our doors. Every artist, company, and ensemble in the 2025–26 season has come to offer something truly special. There's magic in that. What you will experience is a gift from each artist and from the Harris Theater — an experience curated just for you, our Chicago audiences. I couldn't be more excited to share this season."

A major highlight of the season is the appearance of **The Joffrey Ballet** on November 6–9, 2025. In a program titled **Joffrey at the Harris: Matters of the Heart**, the Joffrey brings two important works to the *HTP Mainstage* series: the world premiere of **Wabash & You** (set in Chicago, with choreography by **Chanel DaSilva** and music by **The Main Squeeze**), and the critically acclaimed **Broken Wings** (inspired by the life and art of Frida Kahlo, with choreography by **Annabelle Lopez Ochoa** and music by **Peter Salem**). Both works draw on themes of love and resilience, expressed through the Joffrey's expert artistry. Other *HTP Mainstage* dance programs include the US premiere of **Nomad**, created by **Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui**, artistic director of the Antwerp-based dance company **Eastman**; ten local dance companies joining forces under the auspices of the **Chicago Black Dance Legacy Project**; and a collection of works from Brooklyn's **GALLIM** and its award-winning artistic director **Andrea Miller**.

In addition to robust dance programming, *HTP Mainstage* continues to bring some of today's most innovative musical leaders to Chicago. The Harris Theater is honored to welcome back

the Grammy Award–winning Silkroad Ensemble with Rhiannon Giddens for Sanctuary: The Power of Resonance and Ritual. Combining music from such diverse traditions as Sicilian tarantella, Moroccan Gnawa, Indian Classical, and American old-time, the program explores the power of trance to forge stronger human connections in an increasingly fractured world. A similar spirit of adventurous combination imbues Steve Hackman's Beethoven X Beyoncé, a mashup of Beethoven's Seventh Symphony with Beyoncé's greatest hits that revels in the commonalities of all great dance music. This high-energy program features the Chicago Philharmonic, a Resident Company of the Harris.

For its *Chamber Music Series*, the Harris Theater welcomes back the *Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center*, a long-time partner which brings its "enviable roster" (*The New York Times*) of musicians to Chicago for four programs, including the annual December holiday performance of the complete *Brandenburg Concertos*. In the fall concert, the viola takes the spotlight, with works by Beethoven, Mozart, and Brett Dean that add an extra viola to the standard string quartet format to create rich sonorities. The *Chamber Music Series* continues in the spring with piano trios by Shostakovich and Schubert, and concludes with an all-French program in May.

The *Mix at Six* series offers engaging, innovative programming at an affordable price on weeknights, making for some of the most anticipated events in Chicago's cultural landscape. This season, three early-evening programs include a performance by **Damon Locks's Black Monument Ensemble**, a Chicago-based multi-generational collective of artists, musicians, and dancers. In her Chicago debut, two-time Jazz FM Vocalist of the Year **Zara McFarlane** performs a tribute to jazz legend Sarah Vaughan. And composer, conductor, vocalist, and multi-instrumentalist **Angel Bat Dawid** premieres *The Souls of Black Folk Suite*, an original work based on the treatise by W. E. B. Du Bois, featuring musicians from **The Great Blk Music Infinity Ensemble** and **D-Composed String Ensemble**.

Now in its 11th year, the Harris Theater's *Beyond the Aria* series brings cabaret-style performances to the intimate Pritzker Stage in collaboration with *Lyric Opera of Chicago* and their *Ryan Opera Center*. In four programs throughout the season, opera stars and series Artistic Director *Craig Terry* curate evenings filled with songs spanning centuries and styles. Dates and artists will be announced this summer.

A reimagined *Family Series* will also be announced later this summer. The new iteration of the series will allow kids to get up close and personal to the music in the welcoming "No Shushing Allowed" environment that Harris Theater families know and love from seasons past.

Featured musical styles include Sicilian tarantella with Mauro Durante and Francesco Turrisi, Moroccan Gnawa with Mehdi Nassouli, Indian Classical music with Sandeep Das, and American old-time with Rhiannon Giddens, among others.

## Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center Brahms, Shostakovich, and Schubert

#### Zara McFarlane

In her Chicago debut, McFarlane performs music from her most recent album, *Sweet Whispers: Celebrating Sarah Vaughan*, which pays tribute to the American jazz legend, nicknamed "The Divine One."

# Eastman / Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui Nomad

With *Nomad*, the Belgian-Moroccan choreographer Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui pieces together a mosaic drawn from the animate and inanimate elements of the desert. The musical landscape transports us to the Middle East and Central Africa, with compositions by Basement Jaxx artist Felix Buxton, Congolese singer Kaspy N'dia and Cherkaoui himself. Performed in its US premiere at the Harris Theater, the work shows glimpses of the adaptability of creatures living in harsh conditions, the fluidity of sand dunes and the ever-changing winds, the constant search for water and safety, for consolation that guides the human quest for spirituality. The life of the desert becomes a metaphor for togetherness and symbiosis, keys to surviving in an arid world.

# Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center Saint-Saëns, Vieuxtemps, and Fauré

This program celebrates chamber music masterworks from 19th-century France. Saint-Saëns's elegantly crafted Piano Trio No. 1 and Vieuxtemps's Viola Sonata are filled with lyrical beauty,

and Fauré's beloved Piano Quartet No. 1 brings the program to a powerful close with its sweeping emotional range.

An anchor institution of Millennium Park and the first multi-use performance venue built in downtown Chicago since 1929, the Harris was established in 2003 to create a much-needed home for the city's vibrant community of midsize performing arts organizations. Today, the nonprofit Harris Theater features some of the most diverse arts and culture offerings in the city, from its Chicago-based Resident Companies to the world-renowned visiting artists who perform on its stage through the Harris Theater Presents series. The Harris represents a distinctive model for artistic excellence, collaboration, and creative symbiosis, making the performing arts relevant and accessible to the widest possible audience. Acting as both a home base and supportive partner for its Resident Companies, the Harris provides state-of-the-art performance space and ongoing support to nearly 30 Chicago-based performing arts organizations. Its 1,500-seat multi-use theater brings innovative and boundary-pushing productions from more than 32 countries across six continents to Chicago, creating unique opportunities for dialogue between Chicagoans and the world's leading artists, thinkers, and innovators. The organization's signature *Harris Theater* Presents series has featured acclaimed artists and ensembles including Joyce DiDonato, Batsheva Dance, the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, New York City Ballet, English National Ballet, Joshua Bell, Monteverdi Choir and Orchestras, Angélique Kidjo, and Paris Opéra Ballet. The Theater's education and community engagement initiatives build bridges between artists and community members, providing master classes, artist talks, and free tickets for more than 35 partner organizations throughout Chicago.
